We hope that you have all had a relaxing half term. Since returning to school, the children have been working incredibly hard and we can't wait to see what they achieve over the rest of the autumn term!



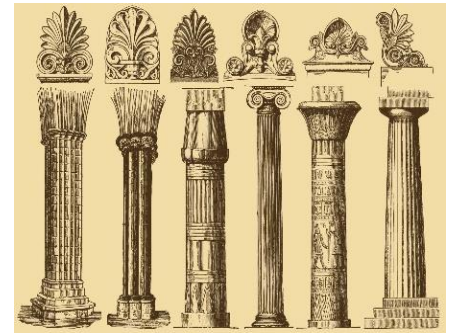
English and Maths

This half term we will be looking at the book 'The Thieves of Ostia' in English. This book, set during the Ancient Ostia, tells the story of Flavia, Jonathon, Nubia and Lupus, four children living in Ostia trying to solve a mystery. We will be using this text to develop our understanding of Ancient Rome as well as writing our own narratives. Expect to hear lots of exciting facts about the Roman era!

In maths, we are going to be applying our knowledge of place value to multiplication and division. The children will be working on both their mental arithmetic skills along with practising column method to support these operations. Additionally, we will be moving on to develop our understanding times tables facts so please keep practising these at home!

Foundation

We are going to be exploring lots of new topics in foundation including looking at how the Romans came to live in Britain and what impact that had on our society. In RE, we will be continuing to look at Hinduism with a focus now on festivals. In science, we will be exploring how sound travels to the ear which will include looking carefully at the structure of our own ears, as well as investigations in to pitch and volume. Renaissance architecture will be the focus of our art lessons, where we will be using paint and pencil to create a range of textures, drawing inspiration from Da Vinci and Michaelangelo.



PE

Reading Journals

Our reading learning journals are a great tool to record how your child continues to practice those key skills at home. Please monitor your child's journal to ensure that they are reading regularly as we know this brings profound and wide-ranging benefits that can have a lifelong positive impact on your children's lives.

Home Learning

All children have access to *Timetable Rockstars* from home. On this platform, children are expected to be **logging on daily for 3 minutes a day**. This is very important for our upcoming national timetable test in year 4 in Summer term.

Children also bring home their spelling journals each day so that they can practise their weekly spellings. They have been learning lots of strategies in class that they can use at home.
